

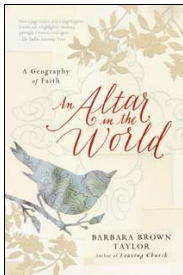

In this critically acclaimed book, Taylor writes of essential spiritual practices that are rooted in daily living. She encourages readers to discover the sacred in the world outside the church's door.

The practices Taylor names do not require anything other than paying attention to life in a new way. In her rich, articulate style she encourages new perspectives on things as simple as walking, carrying water, being with other people, and speaking blessing. Taylor blurs the line between the sacred and secular and demonstrates how the common occasions the holy.

Taylor's passion and tenacity are evidenced as she writes of getting lost, feeling pain and grieving loss as spiritual practices that deepen faith and meet human suffering in a transformative way.

Taylor's writing is deeply incarnational and profoundly faithful. Her words are bread for the journey and encouragement for all who yearn for a deeper connection with the Holy.

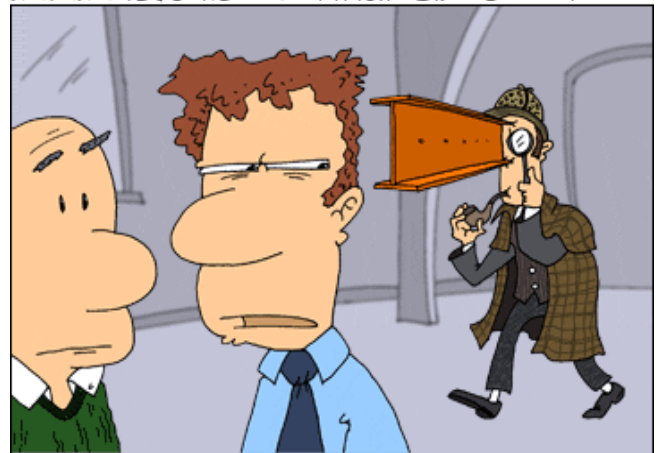
