The United Church of Christ has a rich history that begins in the 1600's with roots in the Congregational church of the Puritans. In 1892 they were joined by Congregational Methodists and in 1925 by Evangelical Protestants. Finally, in 1927 the German Congregationalists joined and formed the Congregational Churches

Another branch of our tradition comes from the Christian churches, which began in 1794. The first free Christian Church was formed in Vermont in 1801 and by 1850 a northeast convention had formed. In 1854 the Southern Christian Convention was formed and in 1922 they came together to form the Christian Church.

These two bodies merged in 1931 and formed the Congregational Christian Churches.
